M&P's Clockshine

Concentrated Carnuaba wax polish

The alternative to conventional clock lacquers

Until recently, Clockmakers have traditionally lacquered the plates and case parts of most clocks to maintain the untarnished appearance of the brass, but more and more repairers are turning to Clockshine, a Carnuaba wax based protective polish. This very hard wearing polish is applied in very small quantities to the finished surfaces, and then polished off with a clean lint-free duster.

The fine even coating is almost invisible, yet provides a seal over the brass, preventing tarnishing.



If applied according to the instructions, it can last as long as shellac based lacquers, and retain the 'just polished' look for longer. It is especially useful on carriage and 400 day clocks. Unlike lacquer, it won't scratch, will not create 'rainbow' effects, and the owner of the clock simply has to buff up the brass from time to time to retain the polished effect. This is not a brass polish to remove tarnish, but a long lasting protective coating.

- 1. After polishing brass clock plates & cases, remove all traces of polish with M&P's Deagreaser.
- 2. Apply Clockshine to the brass with a soft cloth.
- 3. Polish off with a duster.
- 4. Pivot holes should be cleaned with pegwood after application.
- 5. Highly concentrated, this 50ml bottle will be enough to do a large number of clocks.
